**BILLING STATEMENTS:** Students receive monthly billing statements in hard copy and/or electronic format.

**PROOF OF HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION:** Purdue Global requires students to attest to or submit proof of graduation from high school or its equivalent. All students who possess a General Education (GED) certificate, state-specific equivalent diploma, home study certificate or transcript, or a foreign secondary education credential must submit their proof of graduation prior to enrollment. Graduates of foreign high schools must provide proof of secondary completion prior to enrollment. If Purdue Global previously received official proof of high school graduation, the student will not be required to provide proof during subsequent enrollments.

**Proof of Prior Degree**

Students enrolled in a program for which a prior degree is required must furnish an official transcript indicating receipt of a comparable degree from a college or university accredited by a regional or national accrediting agency recognized by the U.S. Department of Education by the last day of the first term. **Refund Policy**

Applicants who are:

- dismissed as a result of failing to meet the minimum entrance assessment score; or
  - undergraduate students who choose to withdraw by the end of week 3 of the first term (within Purdue Global Commitment trial period);
- shall be entitled to a refund of all monies paid, with the exception of the nonrefundable application fee.

**CANCELLATION OF ENROLLMENT AGREEMENT: Three-Day Cancellation**—An applicant who provides written notice of cancellation within 3 days (excluding Saturday, Sunday, and federal and state holidays) of signing an enrollment agreement is entitled to a refund of all monies paid. After the 3-business day period, Purdue Global will retain the application fee. No later than 45 days of receiving the notice of cancellation, the school shall provide the 100% refund (less application fee).

**INDIANA RESIDENTS—Six-Day Cancellation**—An applicant who provides written notice of cancellation within 6 days (excluding Saturday, Sunday, and federal and state holidays) of signing an Enrollment Agreement is entitled to a refund of all monies paid. No later than 30 days of receiving the notice of cancellation, the school shall provide the 100% refund.

**DROPPING COURSES:** Students may drop a course prior to or during the first 7 calendar days of the course without any financial obligation. Students who drop a course beyond the first 7 calendar days will incur 100% financial responsibility for the course.

## NOTICE TO STUDENTS

**Return of Title IV Financial Aid:** If you withdraw or are dismissed from the University up through the 60% point in any payment period and received federal financial aid in the form of grants or loan funds, federal law requires that the University, and in some cases you, the student, return funds you did not earn to the U.S. Department of Education. In these situations, federal Title IV financial aid must be recalculated. Recalculation is based on the percentage of earned aid using the following Federal Return of Title IV Funds formula:

1. To determine the percentage of the payment period or term completed, the number of days completed up to the last date of academic attendance is divided by the total days in the payment period or term. (Any break of 5 days or more is not counted as part of the days in the term.) This percentage is also the amount of Title IV financial aid earned.
2. To determine the amount of aid to be returned, subtract the percentage of aid earned from 100% of the aid that could be disbursed and multiply it by the total amount of aid that could have been disbursed during the payment period or term as of the date you withdrew. Funds are returned to the appropriate federal program based on the percentage of unearned aid using the following formula: After the 60% point in the payment period, you will have earned 100% of the federal financial aid funds already disbursed to you. This calculation concerning federal financial aid is separate and distinct from the institutional refund policy, and may result in you owing additional funds to the University to cover tuition charges previously paid by federal financial aid prior to your withdrawal.
3. If you earned less aid than was disbursed, the institution would be required to return a portion of the funds and you are required to return a portion of the funds. Keep in mind that when Title IV funds are returned, you, the student borrower, may owe a debt balance to the institution. If you earned more aid than was disbursed to you, the institution would owe you a post-withdrawal disbursement, which must be paid within 180 days of your withdrawal.
4. If you plan to withdraw from the University, you should contact the Financial Aid or Business Office to determine the amount of funds that must be returned on your behalf, if applicable. All refunds due will be made within 45 days of your effective withdrawal date. The last date of actual attendance is used in calculating any refund amount.

There are some Title IV funds that you may have been scheduled to receive that cannot be disbursed to you once you withdraw because of other eligibility requirements.

If you receive (or your school or parent receive on your behalf) excess Title IV program funds that must be returned, your school must return a portion of the excess funds equal to the lesser of:

- Your institutional charges multiplied by the unearned percentage of your funds, or
- The entire amount of excess funds.

The school must return this amount even if it did not keep this amount of your Title IV program funds. If your school is not required to return all of the excess funds, you must return the remaining amount.

For any loan funds that you must return, you (or your parent for a Direct PLUS Loan) repay in accordance with the terms of the promissory note. That is, you make scheduled payments to the holder of the loan over a period of time. Any amount of unearned grant funds that you must return is called an overpayment. The maximum amount of a grant overpayment that you must repay is half of the grant funds you received or were scheduled to receive. You do not have to repay a grant overpayment if the original amount of the overpayment is \$50 or less. You must make arrangements with your school or the Department of Education to return the unearned grant funds.

The requirements for Title IV program funds when you withdraw are separate from any refund policy that your school may have. Therefore, you may still owe funds to the school to cover unpaid institutional charges. Your school may also charge you for any Title IV program funds that the school was required to return. Your school can also provide you with the requirements and procedures for officially withdrawing from school.

**Return of Unearned Tuition Assistance:** Military Tuition Assistance (TA) is awarded under the assumption that you will attend school for the entire period for which the assistance is awarded.

If you withdraw or are dismissed, you may no longer be eligible for the full amount of TA funds originally awarded. Purdue Global will return any unearned TA funds on a proportional basis through at least the 60% point of the period for which the funds were provided, with unearned funds returned based upon your last date of attendance (LDA).

If you stop attending due to a military service obligation, and notify Purdue Global of that obligation, Purdue Global will work with you to identify solutions that will not result in a debt balance for the returned portion.

**Calculation:** When you officially withdraw or are dismissed from a course, the LDA will be used as the date of withdrawal.

Failure to start a course or attend a course for 21 consecutive calendar days (not including breaks; 14 calendar days for 6-week terms) is considered an “unofficial” withdrawal. In this case, Purdue Global will determine the LDA by reviewing the last date of activity within a course: for online courses, the LDA is the last date a student made a contribution to the class or submitted an assignment. For onsite courses, Purdue Global will reach out to the professor to determine the LDA.

Once LDA has been determined, Purdue Global will recalculate your TA eligibility based on days attended in accordance with the Military Students Using Tuition Assistance Refund Chart.

**Return of Funds:** Determining eligibility for TA is course specific. The start and end dates will be used for each course to determine eligibility. Using the Military Students Using Tuition Assistance Refund Chart below, Purdue Global will be required to return some or all of the TA awarded to you if you did not complete at least 60% of each course, possibly creating a debt balance on your Purdue Global ledger.

**WITHDRAWAL FROM PURDUE GLOBAL AFTER COMMENCEMENT OF CLASSES**

The effective withdrawal date for a student shall be when any of the following occur:

1. The date the student notifies Purdue Global of withdrawal or the date of withdrawal, whichever is earlier,
2. The beginning date of any term in which a student fails to start classes or requests to withdraw within the first 7 calendar days,
3. The last date of attendance following any 21 consecutive calendar days of absences (not including breaks; 14 days for students enrolled in 6-week terms),
4. The last date of attendance prior to the date when Purdue Global terminates the student’s enrollment, or
5. The date that you are scheduled to return from a leave of absence and fail to do so.

All refunds due will be made within 45 days of your effective withdrawal date. The last date of attendance is used in calculating any refund amount.

**Note:** If you are participating in the Purdue Global Commitment and elect to continue beyond the first 3 weeks, you are responsible for the full tuition amount for that term.

**TUITION REFUND CHART**

If you have completed the Purdue Global Commitment period or are a continuing student, you are subject to the Purdue Global Refund Policy and the Tuition Refund Chart.

This policy applies to all students, including military students using tuition assistance, with the exception of international students. International students should refer to their International Enrollment Agreement.

The institutional refund (tuition) is based on the same formula as the Title IV (R2T4) formula, which is based upon the actual daily percentage of the term attended: days completed (LDA) divided by the length (days) of the term. Days within the winter break are not counted toward the term period.





## Permission to Register

After completion of your enrollment, The Office of Student Support will work with you to complete your course registration. You may choose to provide your Student Advisor permission to register you for courses on your behalf. This is a great option if you are an active student with limited time available to meet with your Student Advisor.

If you are attending Purdue University Global as a first-term student, have submitted transcripts, or are enrolled in certain Purdue University Global programs, you may require counseling with a Student Advisor prior to course registration. In these instances, a Student Advisor will contact you to discuss course options and sequencing.

You may register for up to three (3) terms in advance and will receive a confirmation of registration via email from your Student Advisor. Should you decide to change your course registration, please contact your Student Advisor for assistance. You may also be eligible to change your course registration via the self-registration tool located in Purdue Global Campus.

### Not Granting Permission to Register

I prefer to speak to my Student Advisor each term to talk through the next set of courses within my degree plan. By choosing this option I am not allowing permission for my Student Advisor to automatically register me for courses.

### Granting Permission to Register

I understand that acknowledging this form authorizes my Student Advisor to register me for current and subsequent courses in my degree plan in sequence, and in accordance with Purdue University Global policies without verbal contact. Add/drop week is the first 7 days of the term.
